
Parkwood Resident's Association: News Update

NIH Bio-terrorism Facility Update

In response to opposition from surrounding neighborhoods to the proposed biodefense facility, NIH has agreed to carry out a hazard/risk assessment study. The results of the study will be reviewed by a task group made up of 3 members of the NIH Community Liaison Council and an NIH official, and I will be part of this group. The Council now includes a representative from Stone Ridge School. Additionally a staff member from Rep. Van Hollen's office has attended recent meetings in response to his interest in this issue. It is difficult to predict what effect, if any, a negative study result would have on NIH plans, and it may not be possible to prevent the construction of this facility at the corner of Rockville Pike and Cedar Lane. However, I will strenuously continue to oppose NIH plans to use live anthrax in this facility (Building 33).

Rockville Pike Traffic Relief

Are you or someone else in your community significantly inconvenienced by the no left turn between 4-6 on Rockville Pike and Cedar Lane (east)? The Maryland State Highway Administration wants to give us a left turn, 24/7, but this involves narrowing the median strip for several hundred feet on Rockville Pike to create a "holding lane". This can be accomplished this year with funds already in their budget. We have to identify it as a priority so the district engineer can take our correspondence or e-mails when he presents before the new secretary of transportation. CKC Writes to County Executive

At its January meeting, the Coalition of Kensington Communities (CKC) hosted newly elected council member from District 5 Tom Perez and Carol Bowis, Legislative Aide to Council Member Howard Denis, District 1. The purpose of the meeting was to provide a comprehensive snapshot of the issues of importance to the residents of the Kensington area.

The CKC is a one-year-old umbrella group comprised of 11 resident/civic associations in the greater Kensington area. Current participants include: Byeford -- Rock Creek Highlands, Capital View Park Citizens Association, Garrett Park Citizens Association, Garrett Park Estates -- White Flint Park Civic Association, KenGar Residents Association, Kensington Estates Civic Association, Kensington Heights Citizens Association, Kensington View, Parkwood Residents Association Rock Hills Citizens Association and Rock Creek Palisades Citizen's Association.

The group voted to write a letter sharing top priorities to County Executive Doug Duncan with copies to the Montgomery County Council President and State Representatives in District 16, 17 and 18. The letter urged Mr. Duncan to focus on the following issues in the County's FY04 budgets:

- Community Center at the HOC site in Kensington
- Adequate Fire and Rescue Services throughout the County
- Focus on Solving Local Traffic Issues
- Maintain the School Modernization Schedule

Another theme that resonated through-out the neighborhoods was a desire for the revitilization of the Kensington Business District. Several community leaders indicated an interest to move more aggressively on the Kensington Concept Plan. This item was not included in the letter to the Executive as it is primarily the Town of Kensington's responsibility to advocate on this issue. A copy of the Kensington Concept Plan is available at the Town Hall. The next meeting of the CKC is Thursday, March 27th to be hosted by the Rock Creek Palisades.

Wheaton Redevelopment Program Status

We are on target to start construction in 2003 on a number of projects, geared to revitalizing Wheaton's urban district. We are looking forward to the following new developments:

- A fourth anchor store, Macys is scheduled to open in the Westfield Shoppingtown Wheaton in 2005.
- Target has been open since July and reports sales above projections for 2002.
- Giant Food, a full service super market, is under construction, with a projected opening date in October 2003.
- 325 residential units and garage at Georgia Avenue (near Viers Mill), construction to begin in mid-April.
- 42 town homes on the old Wheaton Lumber Site at Blueridge & Grandview Avenues to start mid April.
- Triangle Park, an 8,200 square foot in-fill specialty building at the former Little Tavern site along Veirs Mill Road at Reedie and Grandview will begin construction this year.
- Groundbreaking for Metro Air Rights east and west along Georgia Avenue of 175 residential units with parking and 305 square feet of office/commercial space and 15,000 square feet of retail with parking. Residential to break ground in 2003 and office/commercial to break ground in 2004.
- Montgomery Housing Partnership is renovating the 50-year-old Pembridge Square Apartments a 133-unit complex adjacent to the urban district.
- Good Counsel Developers, John Laing Homes and Centex Homes plan to develop up to 201 residential units on that site after the relocation of Good Counsel in 2005.
- Wheaton Rescue Squad will develop a new operations center and community/social hall at the corners of Georgia and Arcola Avenues.
