#### TRANSPORTATION ISSUES

#### **Update on Cedar Lane Traffic**

Last year, PRA sent a letter to Montgomery County officials expressing concern about the unsafe traffic and pedestrian conditions along Cedar Lane/Summit Avenue between Knowles and Beach Drive. County officials studied the traffic patterns and volumes in September and determined that the roadway should be narrowed between Knowles Avenue and Beach Drive. The traffic study also found that the relatively low volume of traffic (about 4000 cars/day) could easily be accommodated with two through lanes and no deflection of traffic to other commuting streets or side streets.

#### **Beltway Study**

With the effective dismissal of the planned ICC, the Maryland DOT is analyzing a range of alternatives as part of its study to improve travel along the Beltway. PRA representatives attended a meeting sponsored by DOT.

#### KENSINGTON PARKWOOD SCHOOL

At the opening of the school year 97-98, KPES staff found four classrooms with severe mold contamination and three teachers experienced pronounced respiratory distress while in the rooms. More recently, three additional teachers filed IAQ complaints and numerous parents came forward with reports (verbal and written) from their children's allergists claiming that their health problems are most probably due to mold and other allergens at the children's school. In addition, the school also suffers from insufficient fresh air. The ventilation units were designed and installed more than twenty years ago, when the laws required ventilators to supply only one third the amount of fresh air as current code requires. Furthermore, decades of neglect with virtually no maintenance has likely left the units functioning well below their designed capacity.

After significant community and political pressure, MCPS is finally being forced to take these problems seriously. At the two most recent PTA meetings (one specifically held to address IAQ issues), which were attended by MCPS representatives, the PTA hammered out tasks and commitments to remedy both the mold and the ventilation problems in a timely manner.

#### **GET INVOLVED!**

Dr. Wilkes, parent of two KP students and a private researcher/consultant specializing in exposure to indoor contaminants, served on the IAQ Process Action Team and has been spearheading the PTA's efforts to get these problems solved.
